#### KARACHI

- With a total of 18 million inhabitants (Karachi contributes to approximately 10 per cent of Pakistan's total population),
- Financial hub of Pakistan
- 60 per cent of its inhabitants live in katchi abadis (slums) often without proper water or sanitation systems.
- Illiteracy, poverty and lack of social security systems, further compounds poor access to healthcare for the most vulnerable in the city.

# CIVIL HOSPITAL KARACHI

- Civil Hospital Karachi is a 1,900-bed tertiary care public hospital
- The largest teaching hospital in Pakistan, catering not only to all areas of the province of Sindh but also the neighboring province of Balochistan
- Provides laboratory, radiographical procedures, investigations and examinations free of cost.
- An average of two million out-patients report to the hospital annually

# AMAN FOUNDATION EMS



#### AMAN FOUNDATION EMS

- A fleet of 100 ambulances serving all parts of Karachi and manned by doctors and trained Paramedics;
- AMANAMBULANCE, has redefined en route, in-transit ambulatory care in the city of Karachi.
- Managed by a central Command and Control Center, with an average response time of 8 mins, the service has achieved more than 500,000 interventions to date.
- The service ensures delivery to the hospital facilities within the 'Golden Hour' thus considerably reducing the incidence of avoidable deaths.

# AVAILABLE DATA FROM OUR CENTER

- Annual incidence of non-traumatic out of hospital cardiac arrests = 194/100,000
- Survival = 1%
- Location of Arrest being public is associated with 42% higher chances of death after OHCA
- The burden of OHCA is much higher in Pakistan compared to Western and other cities in the region



#### PROGRESS

- Current status: In the process of starting the project
- Ethics Review Committee/IRB approvals
  - Received exemption from all 3 institutions
- Grant Internal Review Process at Aga Khan University
  - Completed
- MOU between AKU Research Office and SCRI
  - In Process





- Hiring and training of personnel
  - Awaiting processing at Finance and HR departments at AKU
  - Training includes:
    - Introduction to PAROS, implementation of PAROS instrument and communication skills in the emergency department
- Data Collection begins: June, 2015
- Our commitment : 90 patients / quarter (with plans to exceed commitment)
